

PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

SPECIAL SESSION—DECEMBER 16, 1890.

The following entitled ordinance was read the first time:

G. O. 62, 1890—An ordinance repealing an ordinance entitled "An ordinance to vacate a portion of Meridian street for Union Railway purposes, also, to provide for the building of a foot bridge over the portion of street so vacated, and the building of a viaduct over the Union Railway tracks between Meridian and Pennsylvania streets," being General Ordinance No. 36, of the year 1886, and also providing for the erection of a viaduct and approaches on Virginia avenue, between Maryland and Louisiana streets, over the railroad tracks lying in Virginia avenue, and on each side of Pogue's Run.

On motion by Alderman Laut, the Rules were suspended for the purpose of placing G. O. No. 62, 1890, on its final passage, by the following vote:

AYES, 7—viz: Aldermen Blackwell, Farrell, Laut, Reilly, Reynolds, Smith and President Thalman.


NAYS—None.
