GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 6, 1958

An ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 8, Section 4-812 thereof, by the addition of sub-section 290 thereto, prohibiting the owner, driver or operator of any vehicle from parking, stopping or standing at all times between certain designated points on certain designated streets, subject to the penalties provided, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.
