Central Standard Time between the last Sunday of September and the last Sunday of April each year, and at 7:30 o'clock P.M. advanced Indiana statutory time between the last Sunday in April and the last Sunday in September.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED that this Common Council recommends to the Executive and Administrative Departments of the City of Indianapolis that during the periods of time between the last Sunday in September and the last Sunday in April that the public business of the City of Indianapolis be conducted between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 3:30 o'clock P.M. Central Standard Time, and one hour later under advanced Indiana statutory time between the last Sunday in April and the last Sunday in September.

BE IT FINALLY MOVED that this Council recommends and urges all citizens of Indianapolis, churches, businesses, commercial establishments, theaters, factories, schools and all other persons and corporations and firms to regulate and adjust their hours of business to correspond with the schedule for public business of the City of Indianapolis as called for by this Council for the conduct of its business and that this be a permanent order of business until changed or revoked.

Which was seconded by Mrs. Francis, and passed by the following roll call vote:


On motion of Mr. Bright, seconded by Mrs. Francis, the Common Council adjourned at 8:35 P.M.
