The Common Council of the City of Indianapolis met in the Council Chamber, Tuesday evening, November 15, 1910, at 7:30 o'clock, in special session, President William H. Johnson in the chair, pursuant to the following call:

REPORTS FROM STANDING COMMITTEES.

From the Committee on Fees and Salaries:

INDIANAPOLIS, IND., November 15, 1910.

To the President and Members of the Common Council:

GENTLEMEN: We, your Committee on Fees and Salaries, to whom was referred General Ordinance No. 83, 1910, being "An ordinance concerning the compensation of officers, heads of departments, clerks, assistants and employes of the Board of Public Works, fixing the salaries therefor and fixing the time when the same shall take effect, and repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith," beg leave to report that we have had said ordinance under consideration and would recommend that the same be amended by striking out all of said ordinance as a whole and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

General Ordinance No. 83—1910: An ordinance fixing the salary and compensation of the employes of the city hall, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the salary and compensation of the employes of the city hall be and the same is hereby fixed as follows, viz.:

The chief engineer shall receive a salary of not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per month.

The assistant engineer shall receive a salary of not to exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per month.

The custodian shall receive a salary at the rate of not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per year, payable monthly.

The assistant custodian shall receive a salary of not to exceed sixty dollars (\$60.00) per month.

The night watchman shall receive a salary of not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month.

Two elevator operators shall each receive a salary of not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month.

Two telephone operators shall each receive a salary of not to exceed thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per month.

The janitors shall each receive a salary of not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) per month.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

And when said ordinance is so amended we would recommend that the same do pass.

By City Controller:

Appropriation Ordinance No. 73—1910: An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$2,200.00 to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the city treasury not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, the sum herein appropriated to be added to and form a part of the fund known as "City Civil Engineer's Inspectors' Salaries" fund.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

By City Controller:

Appropriation Ordinance No. 74—1910: An ordinance appropriating \$1,000.00 to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the city treasury not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, the sum herein appropriated to be used for the payment of the salaries of such employes as may be required to take care of the new city hall building and to operate the engines, boilers and elevators and for the payment of the incidental expenses of maintenance of said building for the balance of the year 1910.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the city treasury not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, the sum herein appropriated to be added to and form a part of the fund known as "City Civil Engineer's Office Accounts" fund.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL AND SPECIAL ORDINANCES.

By City Controller:

General Ordinance No. 84—1910: An ordinance providing for the transfer of the sum of \$1,200.00 from one fund to another in and for the use of the Department of Public Works, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200.00) be and the same is hereby transferred from the appropriation heretofore made for the "Street Repair, Asphalt, Salaries and Wages" fund to the "City Civil Engineer, Corps and Office Salaries" fund, all in and for the use of the Department of Public Works.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.
