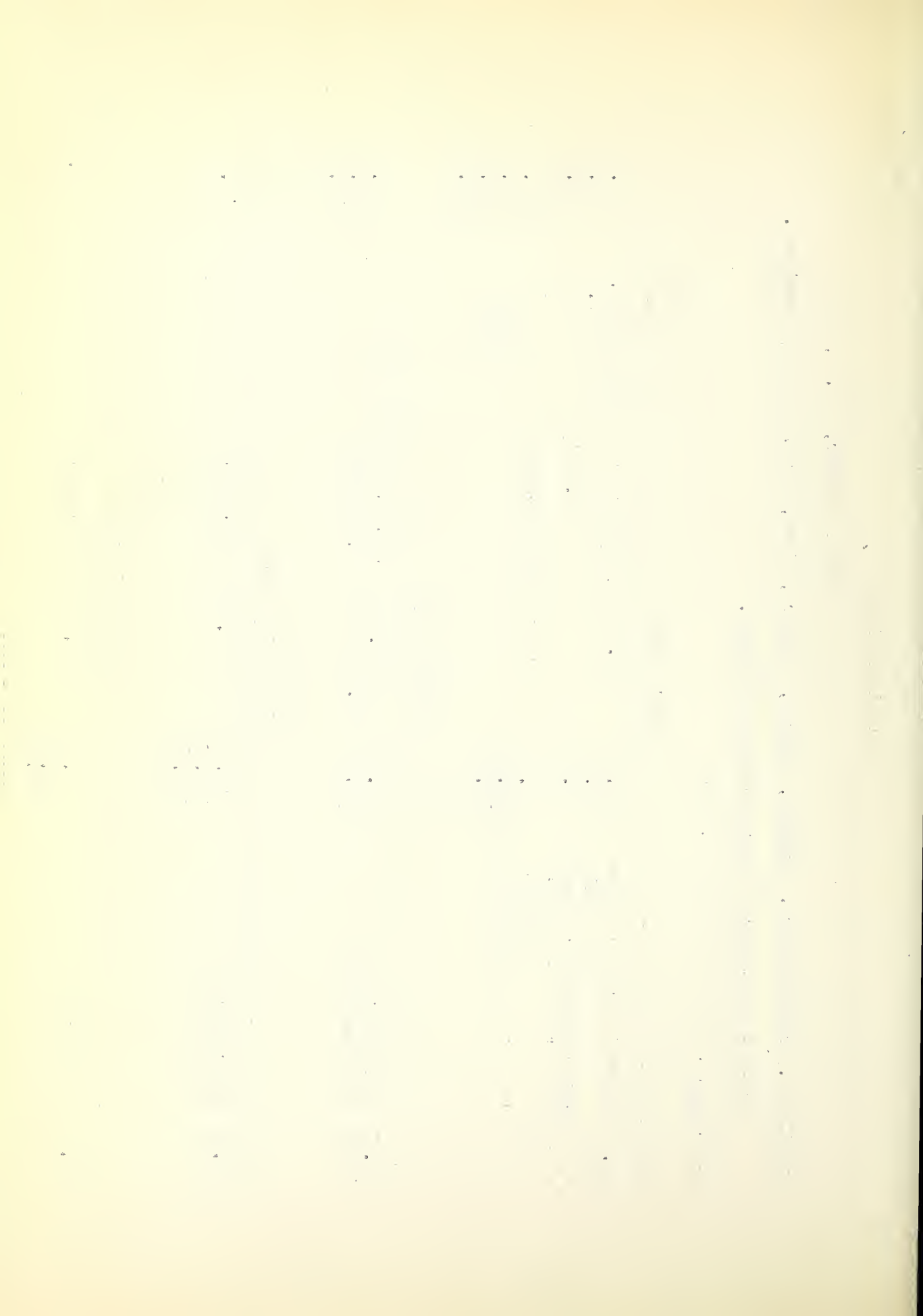

"To the City Council.

Your Street Commissioner reports that he has notified the property owners along Pennsylvania Street between Ohio and Michigan Streets of the order to grade and gravel or pave, on the 16th ult.

Upon the order of the City Council I called upon Wingate Henderson, and another person to collect the amount due the City for the dirt from the respective sidewalks and received from the Wingates \$1.50 and nothing from the others.

The pavement on the North side of Washington St. between Meridian and Pennsylvania Streets has been renewed in a good and substantial manner, save in front of widow Phillip's property, which is under contract, and that between Meridian and Illinois streets, will be done I think without doubt.

Washington Street needs cleaning very badly especially the gutters on North side. The Council will direct the removal of the dirt from said gutters.

Kentucky Avenue has been graded and graveled according to contract and Secretary directed to issue orders according to the contract.

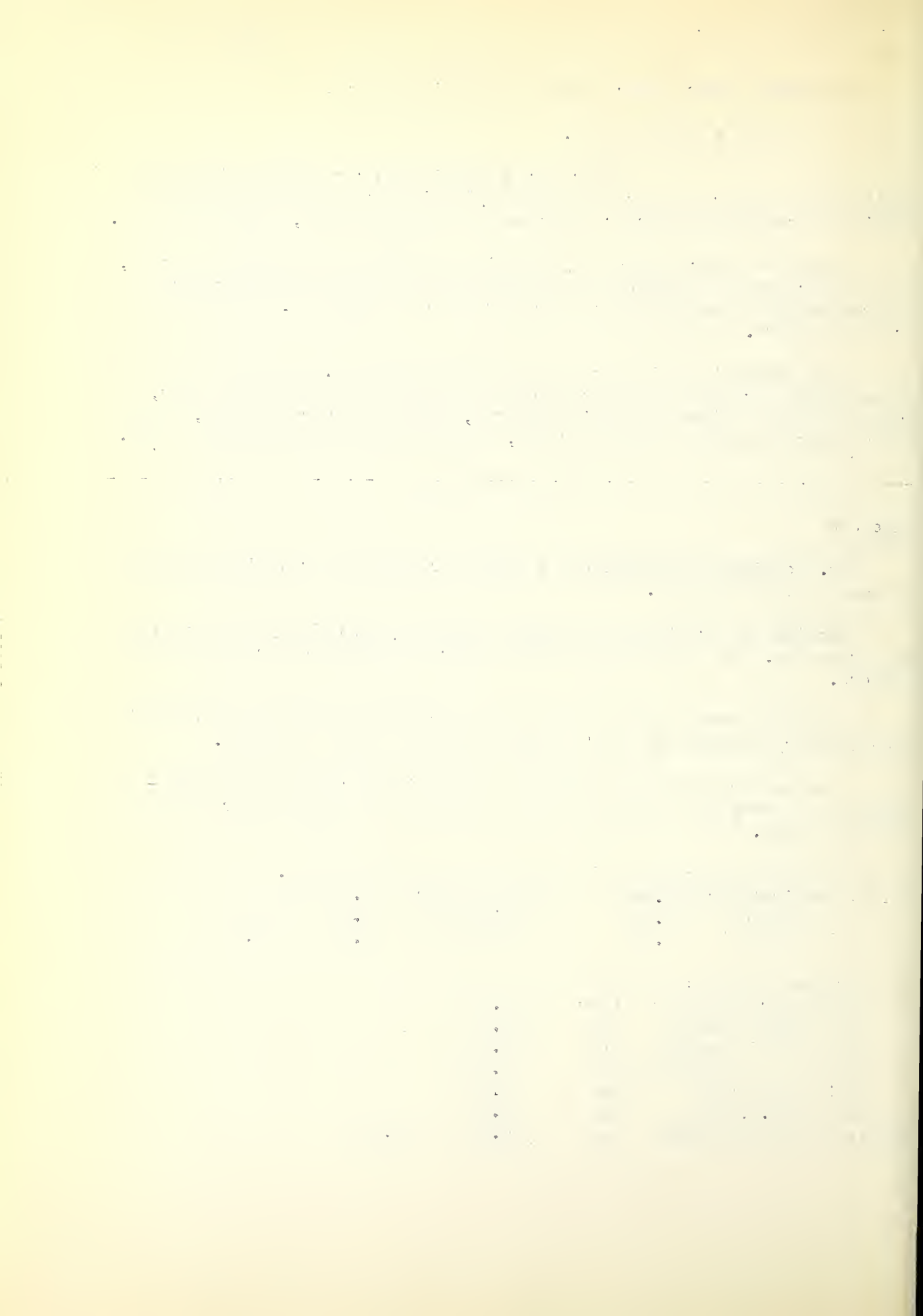
The gutter paved with boulders on Meridian Street South of Washington is in very bad condition owing to having been torn up for the laying down gas pipes.

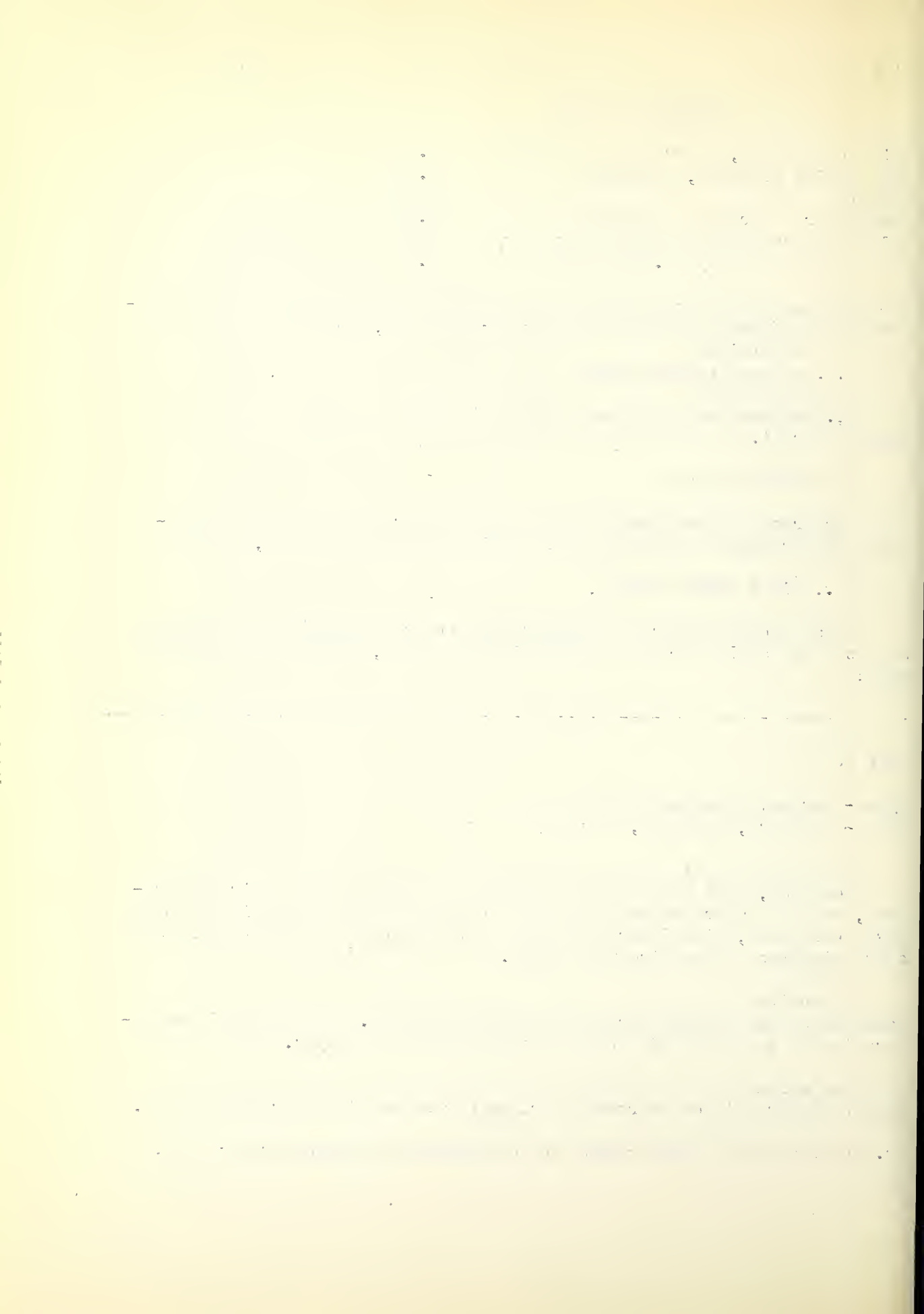

The Secretary was instructed to make a title bond to R.R.Underhill for lots Nos. 35 and 36 according to Washington Hall Company's subdivision on Square No. 98, being 25 feet each, for and in consideration of Seven hundred dollars, payable as follows: three hundred dollars payable January 1st 1852; and four hundred dollars payable January 1st. 1853, with interest.
