In 2d Ward 50¢; 4th Ward \$7.50; 5th ward \$3.50 \$11.50

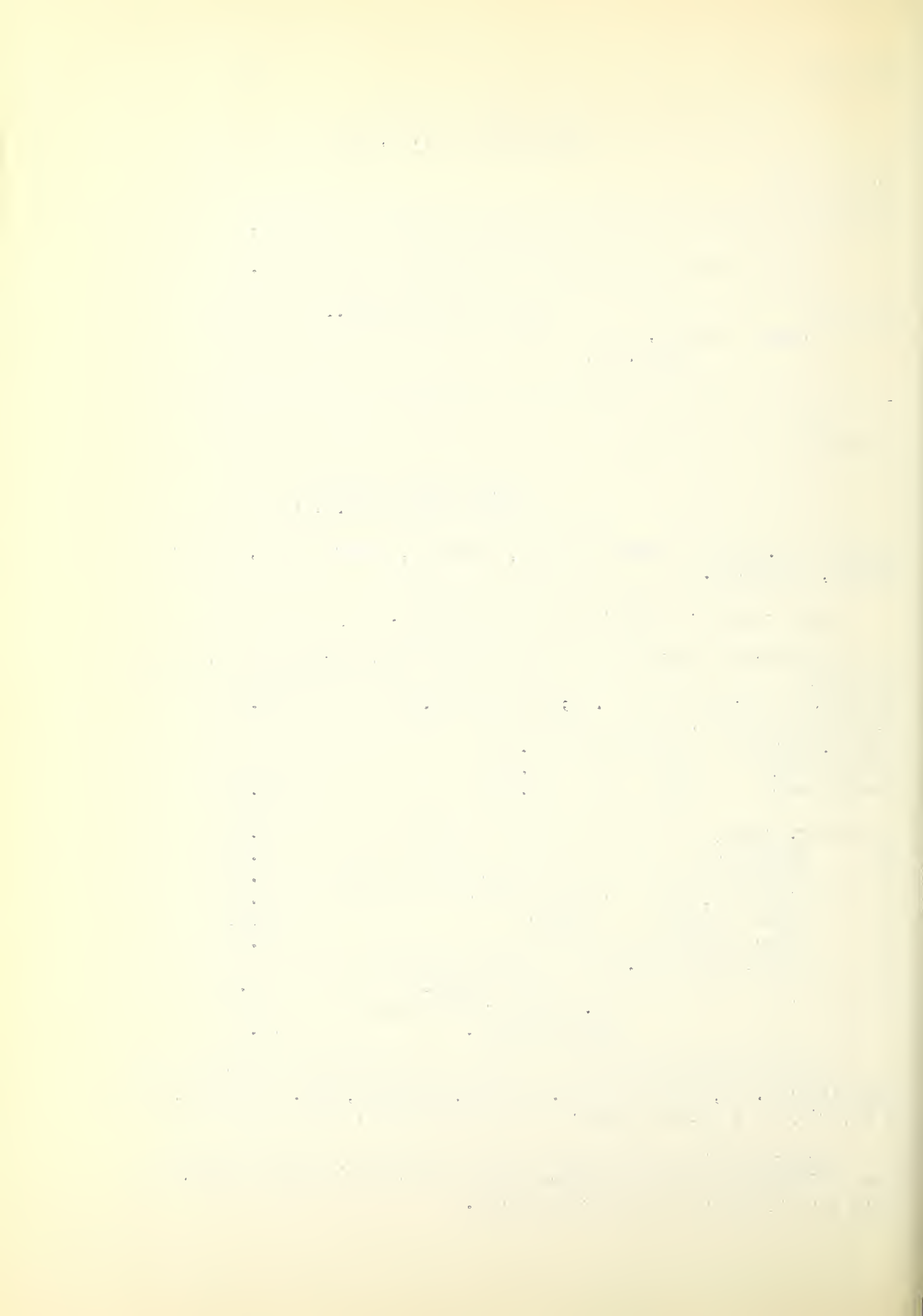

The Secretary announced the result of the election ordered by the Council Sept. 14, 52 as follows. For Tax, 169 votes, agt. 166 votes, being a majority of 3 votes in favor of the assessments: whereupon it was

Ordered That the Secretary proceed immediately to the assessing a tax of 10 cents on the one hundred dollars worth of taxable property upon the Duplicate for the present year.



Resolutions.

Mr. Fitler offered the following:

Resolved That the Committee on Markets contract by public bids for a new roof for the East Market House; also, to have the old part brought to a level with the new; and also, to have the outer edge of the pavement of the East & West Market Houses graveled so as to make dry walks and to run the water from the houses outward.

Adopted.

Mr. Delzell offered the following:

Resolved That the Street Commissioners be directed to make gravel walks on East Street where the same crosses Ohio & Market Street.

Adopted.

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Mr. Fitler offered the following:

Resolved, That the Committee on Fire Department have two shutes placed in the wells in front of the Branch Bank. Adopted.

Mr. Fitler offered the following:

Resolved, That the Commissioners of Streets be directed to gravel the gutter at the crossing of Washington & Tennessee Streets with coarse gravel". Adopted.

Mr. Pitts offered the following:

Resolved, That an appropriation of \$150 be made to purchase a new hose carriage for the use of the Western Liberties Fire Company, to be constructed under the direction of the Company by and with the consent of the Committee on the Fire Department. Adopted.

Mr. Culley offered the following:

Resolved That the Committee superintending the construction of the City School houses be authorized to procure seats, stoves & furniture for the same, as the same are furnished and made ready for use.

On Motion by Mr. Fitler:

The Councilman of the 6th Ward was authorized to expend a sum not to exceed fifteen dollars on the street leading to the Grave Yard to correct evils complained of.

Mr. Buchanan presented the following Petition.

The undersigned, citizens owning property along the West side of East street from Washington to Louisiana streets being desirous of grading and graveling their sidewalks respectfully petition your honorable body for permission so to do, and pray you to direct the setting of grade stakes. For which we will ever pray.

Signed by Fred Ostermyer 195 ft; M ' I. Little 300 ft; Joshua Black 45 feet; S & H Seibert 45 ft; Joseph Heinbach 45 ft; Nick Schendorf 50 feet & John Hanna 45 feet.

On Motion, The prayer of the petition was granted, and it was

Ordered That the City Engineer be directed to set the grade for the same.

On Motion by Mr. Pitts:

The correcting of an evil in West street which was directed to be done under the direction of the committee of Streets and alleys at the meeting of Sept 14 be made the duty of the Street Commissioner.

The President was authorized to contract for wells & pumps to be located near the five cisterns ordered to be built by the City Council.

On Motion by Mr. Buchanan it was

Ordered That the Street Commissioner be authorized to notify the proper person to have culverts built under the Union Railroad track at East street so as to give free passage to water from that street to the creek. And on the failure on their part so to do, the Street Commissioners to make a tunnel through said road for the purpose above stated.

No further business being presented, on Motion the Council adjourned.
