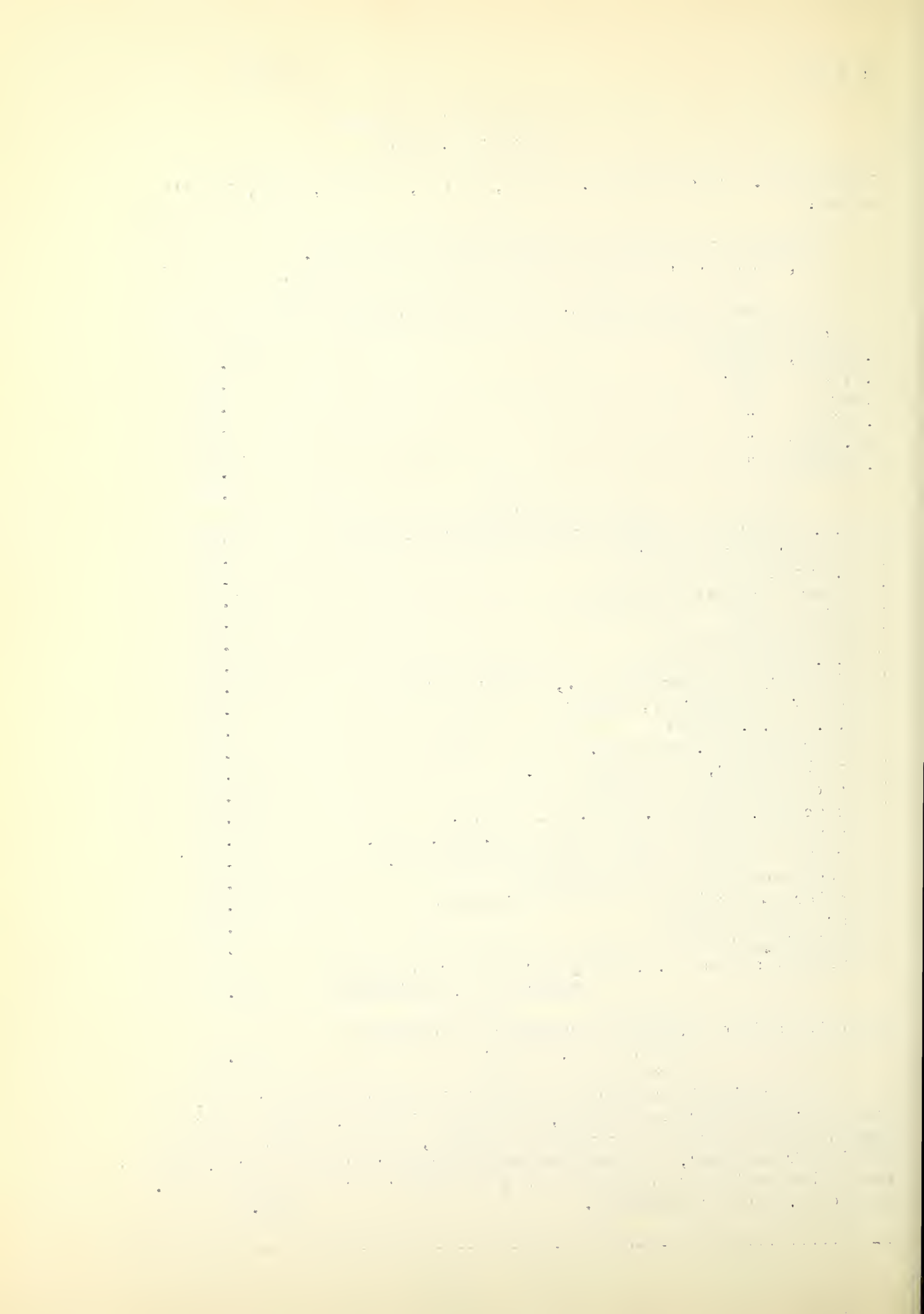

The President presented an account in favor of Oliver Rice, for pumps furnished for use of city, at public cisterns, with a report that said Rice agreed to warrant said pumps, and all others furnished by him for one year, and keep the same in repair free of charge, and for each subsequent year to keep the same in repair for fifty cents each. Allowed O. Rice for Pumps etc. \$34.80

The report of the committee, recommending the building of a bridge across the canal on South Street, also one across the canal on North Street was taken from the table.

On Motion by Mr. Greer it was

Ordered, That the committee on Streets and alleys submit at the next meeting of the City Council, plans and estimates the cost of building the proposed bridges over canal on North and South Streets, and also the plan and estimate of cost of bridge on Noble Street across Pogue's Run."

On Motion by Mr. Delzell it was

Ordered, That the Street Commissioner under the direction of the proper member of the Ward, have the pumps and wells repaired at the several Ward School Houses.

On Motion by Mr. Greer, it was

Resolved, That Mr. Wilson be allowed to cut a ditch on the North side of Georgia Street west to the canal opposite said Wilson lot.

Ordered, That the City Engineer set the stakes for the same.

Mr. Delzell presented a petition from the property holders on east side of New Jersey Street, between Market and Ohio Streets, praying the City Council to order the making of a sidewalk along said East side of New Jersey Street. Signed by

The prayer of the petitioners was granted.

Ordered that the City Engineer set the grade stakes for the same.

Mr. Pitts presented a petition numerously signed, praying the City Council to cause all obstructions to be removed from the alley lying between Ephraim Croas's property and Robert Johnson's in Block No. 1 Harris addition.

On Motion it was

Ordered, That the Street Commissioners cause obstructions to be removed from the alley mentioned above.

On Motion of Mr. Buchanan it was

Resolved That in the opinion of the City Council no Railroad Company hereafter ought to be allowed to use any Street or alley in the

city for Railroad purposes only so far as to cross the same, and then only by complying strictly with the ordinance on the subject.



On Motion by Mr. Buchanan it was

Ordered, That the City Marshal be required to notify the agent of the Lawrenceburg & Indianapolis Railroad Company to open Louisiana Street east of East Street as required by ordinance so that the citizens can pass along said street without danger to life and limb.

Mr. Culley offered the following ordinance:

An Ordinance supplemental to an ordinance to regulate Public Markets and the duties of the clerks of the same" chapter VI.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of Indianapolis; That from the first day of October to the first day of May following in each week, shall be and they are hereby declared to be, Market days.

Sec. 2. Within the times aforesaid, the Monday Market shall be held at the West Market House, and the Thursday Market at the East Market House; and at each, on the days aforesaid the Market shall be opened by the Market Master by ringing the bell at fifteen minutes before noon, and at 2 o'clock P.M.

Sec. 3. It is hereby made the duty of the Market Master to report to the Mayor without delay, all infractions of this and the original ordinance, particularly the 15th Section.
