Allowed for making sidewalks in the 3d Ward South Side of Ohio between Tennessee & Mississippi Streets. \$50.75

Allowed for making sidewalk along the front of an alley in Square No. facing New Jersey Street 32.34

"The following petition was read:

To the Mayor & Common Council of Indianapolis: Gentlemen:

I wish to lay before you the following proposition. I have a half lot in what is called the Hospital Square fronting east on New Jersey Street and adjoining the School lot in the 1st Ward. The front of said lot I wish to exchange making a north front, giving to the School lot as many Square feet as I get, giving notherefore Sixty five (65) feet on Vermont Street running back across both lots making one hundred feet deep, this will leave the School lot 130 feet on Vermont & 100 feet on New Jersey Street. I propose removing the fences and outbuildings at my expense.

All of which I respectfully Submit E.A. Hall".

Mr. Louden moved to refer the petition to a select committee of three. Carried.

Messrs Delzell, Culley, & Buchanan were appointed said committee.
