Gentlemen:

I have this day approved with my signature and delivered to the City Clerk, Mrs. Teresa Laffey, the following City Ordinances:

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 8, 1963

An Ordinance, appropriating, transferring, reappropriating and reallocating the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00), from a certain specific, designated item and fund in the Department of Public Safety, Traffic Engineer, to a certain other designated item and fund in the same department, created by virtue of the 1963 Budget, General Ordinance No. 66, 1962, declaring an emergency and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 49, 1963

An Ordinance, creating a new position of Personnel Supervisor for the Indianapolis Police Department, and transferring funds for payment of salary, setting out qualifications and giving job description.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 50, 1963

An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 9 thereof, by the addition of subsections to Section 4-902, creating two (2) hour parking meter zones on certain streets, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 55, 1963

An Ordinance abolishing certain positions in the office of the City Clerk and creating other positions, and realigning the salaries as to such newly created positions.

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCE

By Councilman Huber:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 57, 1963

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 13 thereof, by the addition of a subsection to Section 4-1303(2) prohibiting trucks of gross weight in excess of 10,000 pounds on certain streets, providing a penalty for the violation of same and fixing a time when said amendment shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Title 4, Chapter 13, Section 4-1303(2) of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, be amended by the addition thereto of the following sub-

section, as follows:

No.	Street	From	To
aaa	Terrace Avenue	Madison Avenue	East Street

Section 2. This amendment shall be subject to the penalties as provided in Title 1, Chapter 6, Section 1-601 of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, Indiana, 1951, as amended.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, compliance with all laws pertaining thereto and publication as required by law.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on **Finance**.
