## INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE.

## By City Controller:

Appropriation Ordinance No. 5—1913: An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$3,000.00 to and for the use of the Department of Public Safety and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars be, and is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the City Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Safety, the amount appropriated herein to be known as "Relief of Flood Sufferers" fund.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Blumberg moved that the rules be suspended and Appropriation Ordinance No. 5, 1913, be read a second time and placed on its passage. Carried by the following vote:
