INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL AND SPECIAL ORDINANCES.

By City Controller:

General Ordinance No. 1—1914: An ordinance providing for the transfer of \$1,200.00 from a certain fund to a certain fund in and for the use of the Department of Public Health and Charities and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, that the sum of twelve hundred (\$1,200.00) dollars be, and the same is hereby transferred from the Public Comfort Station fund of the Board of Public Works, to the Recreation fund of the Department of Public Health and Charities.

All to and for the use of the Department of Public Health and Charities.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Blumberg moved that the rules be suspended and General Ordinance No. 1, 1914, be placed upon its passage.
