INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCES

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 22, 1934

AN ORDINANCE changing the name of the first street north of Kessler Boulevard, between Central Avenue and Washington Boulevard now known as Sixty-first Street, to Sixtieth Street, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the first street north of Kessler Boulevard, between Central Avenue and Washington Boulevard, now known as Sixty-first Street, shall be and the same is hereby changed therefrom to Sixtieth Street, and shall hereafter be known and designated as Sixtieth Street.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

INTRODUCTION OF SPECIAL ORDINANCES

By Board of Public Parks:

SPECIAL ORDINANCE No. 1, 1934

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the sale, alienation and conveyance of certain "park lands" of the City of Indianapolis, and fixing the time when the same shall take effect.

WHEREAS, the Board of Park Commissioners of the City of Indianapolis by resolution duly adopted and spread of record at its meeting on Thursday, April 19, 1934, determined that certain park land hereinafter described are no longer necessary for park purposes nor for the public use and that it would be to the best interests of said City of Indianapolis to dispose of said land by sale, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the Board of Park Commissioners is hereby authorized to sell, alienate and convey for cash, at public or private sale, for not less than the appraised value thereof, which value is to be hereafter determined by appraisers appointed by the Judge of the Circuit Court of Marion County, Indiana, as required by law, the following described real estate in the City of Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana, to-wit:

A part of Section Five (5) Township Fifteen (15) North, Range Three (3) East, in Wayne Township, Marion County and State of Indiana, more particularly described as follows.

Beginning at the southwest corner of the north half of the northwest quarter of Section 5, Township 15 North, Range 3 East, Marion County, State of Indiana; thence east along the south line of the north half of the aforesaid quarter section a distance of 1,760 feet to a point; thence north parallel to the west line of the aforesaid quarter Section a distance of 630.7 feet to a point; thence west parallel to the south line of the north half of the aforesaid quarter Section a distance of 1,760 feet to a point in the west line of the aforesaid quarter Section; thence south along the west line of the aforesaid quarter Section a distance of 630.7 feet to the place of beginning, containing 25.48 acres.

That said real estate shall be sold at public or private sale upon such notice or notices as the Board of Park Commissioners may determine.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE establishing certain passenger zones and/or loading zones in the City of Indianapolis, pursuant to the provisions of Section 26 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended by General Ordinance No. 31, 1931, as amended by General Ordinance No. 58, 1931, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That for the purpose of providing the owners or occupants of certain premises fronting on certain public streets of the City of Indianapolis with ingress and egress for passengers and freight coming to or going from such premises, such

owners or occupants having complied with the provisions of Section 26 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended by General Ordinance No. 31, 1931, as amended by General Ordinance No. 58, 1931, by making written application and request to the Board of Public Safety for the establishment of such passenger and/or loading zones as hereinafter set out, said board having caused an investigation to be made thereof, and said board having recommended the establishment of such passenger and/or loading zones, and pursuant to the terms of said Section 26 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended by General Ordinance No. 31, 1931, as amended by General Ordinance No. 58, 1931, the following passenger and/or loading zones be and the same are hereby established in the City of Indianapolis, to-wit:

18 feet in front of the Cathcart Apartments
at 103 East Ninth Street;
18 feet in the rear of 210 South Meridian St.,
Carson, Pirie Scott & Company.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.


Appropriation Ordinance No. 21, 1934 was read a third time by the Clerk and passed by the following roll call vote:


On motion of Mr. Houck, seconded by Mr. Henry, the Common Council adjourned at 8:10 P. M.
