## INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

By the Board of Public Works and Sanitation:

### GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 34, 1936

AN ORDINANCE transferring moneys from certain funds in the Department of Public Sanitation 1936 budget, reappropriating and reallocating the same to other designated funds in said department, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the following sums of money now in the following designated funds of the Department of Public Sanitation 1936 budget, to-wit:

### GARBAGE REDUCTION

Fund 11—Salaries and Wages, Regular	-----	\$2,000.00
Fund 12—Salaries and Wages, Temporary	-----	1,200.00
Fund 32—Fuel and Ice	-----	1,875.00

## SEWAGE DISPOSAL

Fund 11—Salaries and Wages, Regular .....	\$2,500.00
Fund 12—Salaries and Wages, Temporary .....	2,000.00
Fund 32—Fuel and Ice .....	4,800.00

Being a total of \$14,275.00, be and the same are hereby transferred therefrom, reappropriated and reallocated to the following designated funds in said department in the amounts specified, to-wit:

## GARBAGE REDUCTION

Fund 25—Repairs .....	\$ 300.00
Fund 38—General Supplies .....	300.00
Fund 44—General Materials .....	1,200.00
Fund 45—Repair Parts .....	1,250.00
Fund 72—Equipment .....	1,250.00

## SEWAGE DISPOSAL

Fund 36—Office Supplies .....	\$ 75.00
Fund 38—General Supplies .....	1,000.00
Fund 44—General Materials .....	5,500.00
Fund 72—Equipment .....	3,500.00

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

This was granted.

On motion of Mr. Schumacher, seconded by Mr. Wallace, the Common Council adjourned at 8:45 p. m.
