Upon recommendation of the City Civil Engineer the Board of

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 68, 1936

AN ORDINANCE transferring certain sums of money from certain designated funds in the Department of Public Safety budget, reappropriating and reallocating the same to other designated funds of said budget in said department, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the following sums of money now in the following designated funds of the budget of the Department of Public Safety, to-wit:

be and the same is hereby transferred therefrom, reappropriated and reallocated to the following designated funds of the budget of said department, to-wit:

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 69, 1936

AN ORDINANCE amending certain sections of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, commonly known as the Traffic Ordinance, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That sub-section (b) of Section 30 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, commonly known as the Traffic Ordinance, be amended by adding thereto the following clause:

“(62) Market Street, on the south side, between Noble and Davidson Streets.”

Section 2. That clause (3) of sub-section (c) of Section 30 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, commonly known as the “Traffic Ordinance,” be amended to read as follows:

“(c) Noble Street, on the east side, from Virginia Avenue to Michigan Street.”

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor, and publication according to law.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

By the Board of Public Safety:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 70, 1936

AN ORDINANCE amending Section One (1) of General Ordinance No. 52, 1936, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Section One (1) of General Ordinance No. 52, 1936, be amended to read as follows, to-wit:

“Section 1. That Section One (1) of General Ordinance No. 31, 1931 (as amended), be amended to read as follows, to-wit:

“That sub-section (u) of Section 1 of Article 1 of General Ordinance No. 98, 1928, be amended to read as follows, to-wit:

“(u) *Central Traffic District*: That part of the City of Indianapolis included within the limits of the north curb line of North Street on the north; the east curb line of East Street on the east; the south curb line of South Street on the south; and the west curb line of West Street on the west; also on both sides of Capitol Avenue from the north curb line of North Street to the south curb line of St. Clair Street; also on both sides of East Washington Street, from the west curb line of Noble Street to the east curb line of East Street; also on both sides of West Washington Street, from the west curb line of West Street to the east bank of White River; also both sides of North Illinois Street, from the north curb line of North Street to the south curb line of West St. Clair Street; also both sides of North Meridian Street, from the north curb line of North Street to the south curb line of St. Clair Street; also both sides of North Pennsylvania Street, from the north curb line of East North Street to the south curb line of East St. Clair Street; also both sides of North Delaware Street, from the north curb line of East North Street to the south curb line of East St. Clair Street; also both sides of East St. Clair Street, from Meridian Street to Pennsylvania Street; also both sides of Massachusetts Avenue, from the north curb line of East North Street to the south curb line of East Tenth Street; also both sides of East Tenth Street, from Massachusetts Avenue to Oriental Street; also both sides of Brookside Avenue, from Tenth Street to Twelfth Street, shall be known as the Central Traffic District or Congested District.”

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and publication according to law.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

By the City Controller:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 71, 1936

AN ORDINANCE transferring moneys from certain funds and re-appropriating same to other designated funds and fixing a time when same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the sum of \$200.00, now in Street Commissioner's Department—Gasoline Tax Fund No. 25—(Paved Streets) and the sum of \$300.00, now in Street Commissioner's Department—Gasoline Tax Fund No. 43—(Paved Streets), be and the same is hereby transferred therefrom and re-appropriated in the total amount of \$500.00 to Street Commissioner's Department—Gasoline Tax Fund No. 32—(Paved Streets).

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Works.

ORDINANCES ON SECOND READING

Mr. Wallace called for General Ordinance No. 66, 1936, for second reading. It was read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Wallace, seconded by Mr. Cable General Ordinance No. 66, 1936, was ordered engrossed, read a third time and placed upon its passage.

General Ordinance No. 66, 1936, was read a third time by the Clerk and passed by the following roll call vote:

The Chairmen of the Committees, to whom were referred General Ordinances Nos. 27, 51, 63, 67 and Appropriation Ordinances Nos. 29 and 30 of 1936, asked for time for further consideration of the same, which was granted.

On motion of Mr. Oren, seconded by Mr. Wallace, the Common Council adjourned at 8:20 p. m.


