Resolved That the Marshal request the owners of all horse racks on Pennsylvania and Meredian Streets to remove the same; and in case of their not complying that the Marshal remove the same as nuisances.

On Motion Ordered that Samuel Goldsberry receive proposals for erecting 100 feet of horse rack at east Market and that George Norwood receive proposals for erecting 100 feet of horse rack at east Market and that they conclude the agreement for said work.

Resolved That the committee on Cisterns be authorized and directed to substitute wells in lieu of Cisterns and that said committee receive proposals and contract for the construction of four to be located as follows; on Washington Street at Allabama, Pennsylvania, Meredian and Illinois Streets; & that the mode of construction be left discretionary with said committee.

On Motion of Mr. Seibert.

Resolved That a committee be appointed to lay off the Grave Yard and contract for posts to be set therein as guides.

Messrs Norwood, Goldsberry & Little were appointed said committee.

On Motion of Mr. Cox

Ordered that the Marshal cause a gravel side wide to made on the North West side of the South West diagonal from the Canal bridge to the Grave Yard.

On Motion of Mr. Goldsberry

Ordered That the Marshal & Treasury be authorized to receive Treasury notes of the demonination of \$5 in payment of dues to the Council - Adjourned
