On reading the petition Mr. Rickards moved to refer it to a select committee with instructions to report an ordinance on the subject agreeable to the wishes of the petitioners. Which motion prevailed Messrs. Rickards, Louden and Rooker were appointed said Committee.

Mr. James Vanblaricum was appointed to act as Marshal during the absence of the present incumbent.
