On Motion of Mr. Griffith

Resolved by the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis That we do solemnly protest against the occupancy of any Street or alley by the Madison and Indianapolis Rail Road Company, for the purposes of a depot for the Madison and Indianapolis Rail Road, within the Corporate limits of said town -- Mr. Goldsberry moved to amend said resolution by providing any street may be used as a depot for said road provided the persons owning the property on each side of said street would give their assent to the same, and called for the yeas, and noes on the amendment. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Goldsberry and Montague. Negative Messrs. Griffith, Loudon and Rooker. The Resolution was then adopted.
