

PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

ADJOURNED SESSION—NOVEMBER 25, 1885.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis, met in the Aldermanic Chamber, Wednesday evening, November 25th, 1885, at seven seven o'clock, in adjourned session.

PRESENT—Hon. Brainard Rorison, President of the Board of Aldermen, in the Chair, and Aldermen Bernhamer, Endly, King, McHugh, Prier, Pritchard, and Tallentire—8.

ABSENT, 1—viz. Alderman Cobb.

Alderman Pritchard moved that when the Board of Aldermen adjourns, it adjourn to meet Saturday evening, November 28th, 1885.

Which was adopted.

By consent, Alderman Bernhamer offered the following resolution; which was unanimously adopted, by a rising vote:

WHEREAS, The members of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis have heard, with profound regret, of the death of the Hon. Thomas A. Hendricks, ex-Congressman of this district, ex-Governor of the State of Indiana, and Vice President of the United States, which occurred in this city—his home for the last quarter of a century—at 4:50 P. M., on the 25th day of November, 1885; therefore be it

Resolved, That the President of this Board and the Mayor of the city, be requested to call the Bodies over which they respectively preside, to meet in special session to take such action as may be deemed appropriate on behalf of the Municipality.

Resolved, further, That as a mark of respect to the deceased, and the eminent services by him rendered, this Board do now adjourn.

On motion, the Board of Aldermen then adjourned.
