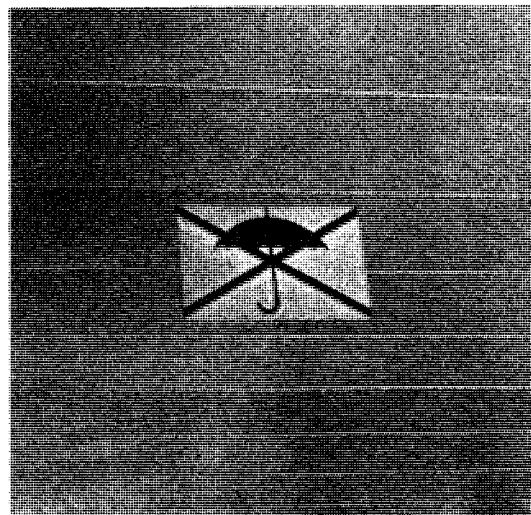
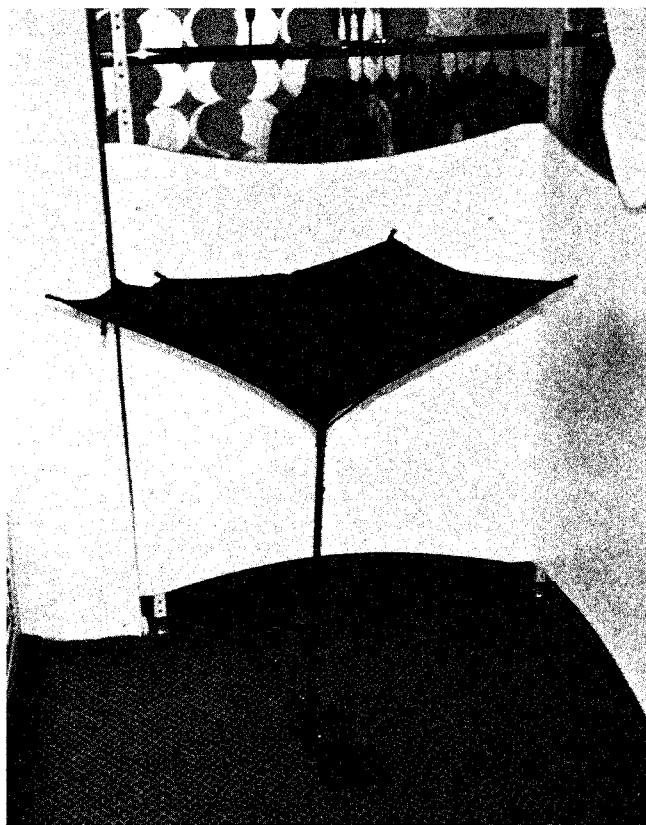

Acid Rain Plagues U.S.

THE UNITED STATES — Research indicates that sulfur dioxide from coal-burning power and industrial plants, especially those in the Midwest, combines with the atmosphere to produce acid rain that damages lakes and forests as far away as New England and Canada. It's estimated that 60-80% of acid rain could be eliminated by using available pollution-control technology.
